The key responsibilities of this position include the following:

- Provide clinical leadership on pathology standards and reporting
- Provide direction on the development of strategies and processes for sharing pathology data quality indicator reports and surgical pathology indicator reports with hospitals, pathologists, and clinicians
- Lead meetings with hospitals performing under provincially set targets
- Provide expertise on data quality issues submitted by hospitals and laboratories
- Provide guidance on documentation of surgical resection/biopsies specimens in synoptic templates
- Provide leadership to a team of cross-functional clinicians and professionals to facilitate implementation of synoptic pathology reporting in Ontario
- Participate in knowledge transfer and education activities for Pathologist Leads across the province, to support improved completeness in pathology reporting
- Participate as the OH-CCO representative on the College of American Pathologists (CAP) Pathology Electronic Reporting Committee (PERT) and applicable sub-workgroups

QUALIFICATIONS

- MD, FRCPC in Anatomical or General Pathology in good standing with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario (CPSO)
- Medical doctor with MD or equivalent qualification licensed to practice in the province of Ontario
- Five to seven years' experience in a professional leadership role focused on quality improvement, preferably outside the hospital setting
- Demonstrated commitment to patient focused care and public accountability
- Enthusiasm for, and commitment to, quality improvement in cancer care at the system level
