POSITION SUMMARY

Ontario Health is seeking expressions of interest from clinical experts, healthcare providers and administrators for the volunteer position of Member, Hepatocellular Carcinoma (HCC) Pathway Map Working Group. Members will work together with the HCC Pathway Map Chairs and the Disease Pathway Management (DPM) program to develop the HCC Pathway Maps.

Ontario Health's DPM program engages multidisciplinary teams to develop disease site-specific pathway maps that represent evidence-based best practice and help to set care expectations across Ontario. The pathway maps are developed following a defined methodology that is multidisciplinary, iterative and consensus driven. More information about DPM's pathway maps can be found [here](#).

ACCOUNTABILITIES

Participation in the working group will include the following activities:

- Highlight evidence (provincial, national, international) that should be taken into consideration in the development of the pathway maps and provide expert opinion on what constitutes best practice where there is a lack of evidence.
- Individually review and provide feedback on the organization and flow of content in the cancer pathway maps.
- Meet the deliverable for the cancer pathway maps in a timely and rigorous manner by adhering to the pathway map development methodology.
- Support the implementation of the external review by recommending key cancer system stakeholders to review the draft cancer pathway maps.
- Provide final endorsement of the cancer pathway maps.
- Provide commentary on performance measures relevant to the pathway maps.

- Dissemination and knowledge translation of the pathway map.

The key deliverable for the working group will be to develop pathway maps that reflect current scientific evidence and represent best practice for HCC.

Time Commitment and Meetings

The working group will be expected to commit 1-2 hours per month over the 2-year term. There will be a greater commitment upfront while drafting the HCC Pathway Maps. Meetings will be scheduled as required and will be held remotely via teleconference. Members of the working group may be asked to review relevant documents circulated electronically between meetings.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Health care providers and/or administrator specializing in HCC care, including radiologists, surgeons, hepatologists, primary care providers, radiation oncologists, medical oncologists.
- Demonstrated commitment to person-centered care, evidence-based medicine, and public accountability

The DPM program strives to convene an unbiased working group with a broad representation across geography, organizations, healthcare disciplines and clinical expertise.
